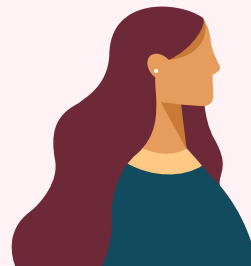
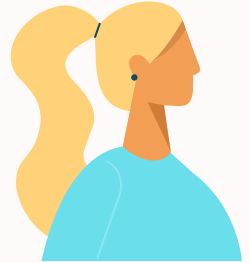

About SCCSS



Sunshine Coast Community Services Society (SCCSS) has been a pillar of the Sunshine Coast community since 1974, embodying a legacy of compassion, commitment, and adaptability.



As a non-government organization overseen by a dedicated volunteer board of directors, we are sustained by a blend of public sector contracts, foundation grants, and generous contributions from the community.

With a workforce of over 85 professional staff members and the invaluable support of 175 volunteers, we administer a diverse array of more than 30 programs spanning four vital areas: Community Action and Engagement; Together Against Violence; Child and Family Counselling; and Family, Youth, and Children's Services.

Our commitment extends across various life stages and circumstances, providing crucial support to pregnant mothers, new parents, families, children, youth, adults, and seniors. Through crisis response, support programs, housing initiatives, and advocacy efforts, we strive to address the multifaceted needs of our community, promoting resilience and compassion.



From Vision to Reality

Needs Discovered

Our journey started in 2017 when the board of SCCSS began exploring both the financial sustainability of the organization and the changing needs of the community.

We learned that the need for affordable housing was reaching a critical level, our main building was reaching the end of its life and many of our programs were oversubscribed.

Thanks to the foresight of the staff and board who stewarded SCCSS before us, we own our land at our main location at the end of Inlet Avenue in Sechelt. Owning this land provided us with an incredible opportunity to redevelop our building and play our part in addressing the affordable rental housing crisis.



The Vision

Working alongside community and government partners we developed a comprehensive plan that will increase our capacity to respond to community needs, and offer many of our programs under a new roof, improving access and making it easier for participants to move

from one program to another. It will also see us playing a role in providing pathways out of homelessness for women and families experiencing violence. In our community, this will mean that women leaving abusive relationships will be able to access Yew Transition House, move to Thyme Second Stage Housing, then on to long-term affordable rental housing.

To help move the plan from vision to reality, we launched our Building Together plan in 2018 — an ambitious Capital Campaign initiative that will fund the construction of a new community services hub, plus 35 affordable housing units for women and families affected by violence or at risk of experiencing violence. The housing will sit above the new community services hub with programs that are accessible to all. The hub will be a versatile gathering space designed to nurture connection and inclusivity - a welcoming environment where individuals can find support, engage in prevention programs, volunteer, work, and grow together.

Nearing Reality

Building Together isn't just about a new building; it's about building hope, dignity, and opportunity. **We are excited to say that in 2024, after several years of work, we received Preliminary Project Approval (PPA) from BC Housing.** PPA is a significant milestone for this project, it means we have received all the approvals needed to put this project out to tender, get the final costing, and begin construction. Shovels could be in the ground as soon as August!

Since retiring and moving to Halfmoon Bay, Lea has found fulfilment in volunteering with SCCSS' Family Place program, where she continues to have a positive impact on families and children in need.

By joining forces with these remarkable women, SCCSS aims to ensure that even more Sunshine Coast residents can benefit from the numerous programs and services offered in our new purpose-built space. This initiative complements our ongoing outreach efforts across the Coast and through our six additional locations, reaffirming our dedication to serving the community and fostering a brighter future for all.

Of the estimated \$34 million needed for the project, SCCSS has already secured 90% of the funds. The '50 Women for SCCSS' campaign aims to raise an additional \$1.5M++ help address the current funding gap.

We will also be making applications to foundations, corporations, and others to gather the full amount.

It is up to us now to bridge the remaining gap. Together, we can build a brighter, more equitable future where everyone has the opportunity to thrive.

Building Together

The need for action has never been more timely! Across the Sunshine Coast, a rising number of women, women with children, and other community members, are facing significant challenges accessing essential resources. From housing insecurity to limited support systems, the struggles are real, and the impact is profound.

That’s why SCCSS is leading this critical initiative — a purpose-built, affordable housing development and community service hub in the heart of Sechelt!

5 Key Project Notes

- 1.** The Building Together project is a 6-story development that will be built on land owned by SCCSS and located in downtown Sechelt.
- 2.** The development will include **35 units of affordable housing designed to prioritize affordability, safety, and dignity for women, including single women, seniors, youth, and others who need access to resources, as well as their children who are vulnerable to or may have experienced violence.**
- 3.** The development will also provide a community hub on its first two floors that will **consolidate many SCCSS programs, including crisis response, housing, and advocacy initiatives such as the Food Bank, Bellies and Babies, Keeping People Housed, Better At Home, and Youth and Counselling Services.**
- 4.** The thoughtful design and community-focused approach of the project will play a vital role in creating a revitalized neighbourhood—one that embraces diversity, fosters safety, and radiates warmth, making it a welcoming place for all.
- 5.** SCCSS has secured 90% of the funding required to build this \$34 million project. To help us achieve our goal, over 50 women from across the Sunshine Coast who have a wide variety of backgrounds and are a mix of professionals, volunteers, and leaders in their community are joining forces to raise the necessary funds through our “50 Women for SCCSS” campaign to help bridge the gap and make this project a reality. But they can’t do it without you!

Rachel’s Path to Mental Health & Empowerment

Facing mental health challenges is a struggle that can sometimes feel amplified in smaller communities like the Sunshine Coast. The fear of stigma and the feeling of isolation was very real for Rachel, but she found support and hope through SCCSS.

Rachel received support through SCCSS’s Arrowhead Clubhouse. The team and community there provided her with the assistance she needed to heal. Through their support, Rachel found a sense of belonging and began her journey to recovery.

Today, Rachel is employed by SCCSS, where she supports others facing mental health challenges. Her experience has come full circle, and she finds great reward in helping others navigate the difficulties she once faced.

Kate's Journey to Safety & Stability

Kate lived with an alcoholic, verbally abusive partner. The constant fear and emotional turmoil took a toll on her, but she hesitated to leave due to the lack of affordable housing options. The situation escalated during an explosive incident when her partner frightened her and destroyed their property. With little more than the clothes in baskets, Kate knew she had to leave for her safety.

Kate sought help from Sunshine Coast Community Services Society (SCCSS) and found refuge in our transition home. Our staff provided her with a safe space, kindness, and the support she desperately needed. They assisted her with her resume, provided food, and even helped her find legal aid to navigate her challenges.

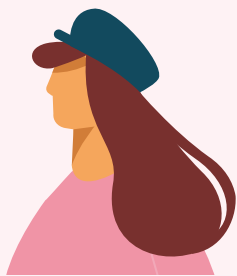
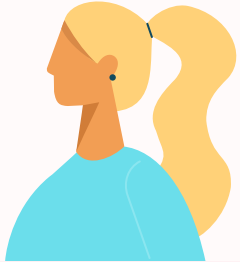
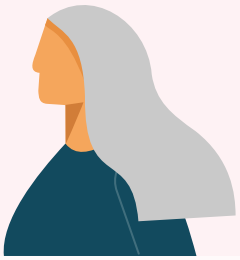
